- o Application Type: Residential boxes usually have fewer circuits (6-24), while commercial or industrial boxes may have more (up to 36 or beyond) to handle higher loads .
- o Phase Type: Single-phase boxes are common in homes and have fewer circuits, whereas three-phase boxes for commercial or industrial use can accommodate more circuits due to higher power capacity .
- o Future Expansion: It is recommended to include extra ways (around 20% more) for future additions like solar panels, EV chargers, or new appliances .
- o Protective Devices: Each circuit requires an MCB, RCBO, or fuse, so the number of circuits is limited by the number of available slots and the box's physical size .

Practical Considerations

- o Load Distribution: Circuits should be grouped logically to prevent overloading and simplify maintenance.
- o Safety Compliance: Ensure the distribution box meets local electrical codes and standards, including proper busbar capacity, neutral and earth bar arrangement, and short-circuit rating .
- o Space Efficiency: Larger boards with more ways require more wall space but allow for better segregation of high-demand appliances and dedicated circuits .
