Typical Dimensions by Type and Application

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Residential/Indoor Wall-Mounted Boxes: Commonly used in homes and offices, these boxes are compact and lightweight, often made of plastic or metal. Typical dimensions range from 200-400 mm in height, 150-300 mm in width, and 80-150 mm in depth, depending on the number of circuits (1-12 ways) ().

o **Material:** Plastic boxes are generally smaller and lighter, while metal boxes offer higher mechanical strength and may be slightly larger to accommodate thicker walls ().

o **Mounting Type:** Wall-mounted boxes are shallower, while floor-standing boxes are deeper to allow easier cable entry and internal wiring ().

o **Indoor vs Outdoor:** Outdoor boxes require additional space for weatherproofing, IP-rated seals, and UV-resistant materials, slightly increasing overall dimensions ().
