Cable models suitable for climbing cable trays include TC, ITC, PLTC, MC, and various data and fiber optic cables, each designed for specific voltage, shielding, and installation requirements.

Power and Control Cables

- o Type TC (Tray Cable): Factory-assembled with two or more insulated conductors, optionally with grounding conductors, rated for 600 volts. Suitable for industrial power or control circuits, flame-retardant, and UL-listed for Class 1, Division 2 hazardous locations. TC cables can be installed in cable trays, raceways, or outdoor locations with messenger support, and TC-ER variants allow short unsupported transitions between trays .

- o Type MC (Metal Clad Cable): One or more insulated conductors with or without optical fibers, enclosed in interlocking metal armor. Rated for 600 volts and medium voltage applications, suitable for indoor/outdoor, wet/dry, and hazardous locations. MC cables must be supported at intervals not exceeding six feet .

- o Type ITC (Instrumentation Tray Cable): Shielded or unshielded, multiple single conductors, rated 300 volts, sizes 22 AWG to 12 AWG. Designed for instrumentation and control circuits, including PLTC-class circuits, with ER-rated variants for continuous support in cable trays .

- o PLTC (Power-Limited Tray Cable): Designed for Class 2 and Class 3 circuits, non-plenum and non-riser, often dual-rated with ITC for flexibility in industrial installations .

Data and Communication Cables

- o Copper Data Cables: Twisted pair or multi-conductor cables for network and control applications, often shielded to reduce electromagnetic interference, suitable for cable trays in data centers and industrial environments .

- o Fiber Optic Cables: Single-mode or multi-mode fibers for high-speed data transmission, designed for installation in cable trays with proper bend radius and strain relief .

Cable Tray System Considerations

- o Material Compatibility: Cables must match the tray material (aluminum, steel, or pre-galvanized) and surface treatment to prevent corrosion or mechanical damage .

- o Load Class and Support: Cable selection should consider the tray's load class, support span, and mechanical strength to ensure safe installation .

- o Environmental Ratings: Cables must comply with fire resistance, RoHS, and REACH regulations, and be suitable for indoor, outdoor, or hazardous locations as required .
