Cable tray enclosures do not have universally mandated colors, but color selection is guided by safety, environmental conditions, and industry standards.

## General Guidelines

Cable tray colors are typically chosen based on visibility, safety, and identification purposes rather than strict regulatory requirements. While the National Electrical Code (NEC) and other standards do not mandate specific colors for cable trays, manufacturers often provide standard finishes such as gray, metallic, or powder-coated colors to enhance corrosion resistance and durability .

## Common Practices

- o Gray or Metallic: Most common for indoor industrial and commercial installations; provides neutral appearance and corrosion resistance .
- o Yellow or Orange: Often used to indicate high-voltage or critical power circuits, improving safety and visual identification .
- o Green or Blue: Sometimes used for data, communication, or low-voltage circuits to distinguish from power cables .
- o Custom Colors: In specialized facilities (e.g., laboratories, hospitals, or high-EMC environments), colors may be selected to match architectural aesthetics or functional zoning .

## Material and Finish Considerations

- o Aluminum trays: Naturally corrosion-resistant; may be anodized or powder-coated for additional protection .
- o Steel trays: Often galvanized or painted; color coatings can provide environmental protection and visual identification .
- o Plastic or FRP trays: Available in various colors; suitable for corrosive or outdoor environments .

## Color Coding for Safety and Maintenance

While not legally required, color coding helps maintenance personnel quickly identify cable types and reduces the risk of accidental interference:

- o Power circuits: Red, orange, or yellow
- o Control circuits: Blue or gray
- o Data/communication: Green or blue
- o Emergency or critical systems: Bright colors like red or orange for immediate recognition
