Position cable tray screws according to the tray width, bracket spacing, and manufacturer guidelines to ensure secure and stable installation.

General Guidelines for Screw Positioning

- o Determine Screw Center Distance For ceiling or suspended installations, the center distance of the screw rod is typically the cable tray width plus 50 mm. For example, a 400 mm wide tray would require a screw center distance of 450 mm . This ensures proper load distribution and stability.

- o Bracket and Rod Alignment

- o Fix the ? brackets to the floor or ceiling using heavy-duty expansion bolts.

- o The expansion center distance for M8x55 bolts is usually 98+-3 mm .

- o Attach the hanging screw rod to the ? bracket with the corresponding bolts, ensuring vertical alignment.

- o Clamp and Washer Placement

- o Place the clamp around the tray siderails.

- o Add a round washer on the threaded rod before lifting the tray section.

- o Thread the rod through the clamp holes, then add a second washer and hex nut to secure the tray at the desired height .

- o Ensure the uppermost hex nut is positioned above the clamp to maintain stability.

- o Fittings and Joint Screws

- o Fittings such as bends, tees, and reducers should be screwed onto the tray rail using truss-head bolts (FRS) and combination nuts .

- o All joint plates have integrated beading to protect cables and should be fastened securely to prevent movement.

- o Spacing Considerations

- o Maintain consistent spacing between screws and clamps to avoid sagging and ensure the tray can support the expected cable load.

- o For long runs, additional support rods or clamps may be required according to the tray width and load specifications.

- o Safety and Handling

- o Always wear protective gloves to prevent cuts from tray edges.

- o Only trained personnel should perform electrical and mechanical installation work .

- o Avoid over-tightening screws, which can deform the tray or fittings.
