

Can a gigabit router be used with fiber optic cable

How It Works

Required Equipment

- o Fiber Optic Cable: Provided by your ISP, typically with SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors .

Connection Steps

- o Install the ONT: Connect the fiber optic cable from the wall outlet to the ONT and power it on. Wait for the status lights to stabilize .
- o Connect ONT to Router: Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port. Power on the router and configure settings such as VLAN, DHCP, or PPPoE if required by your ISP .
- o Verify Connection: Check the router's indicator lights and test internet speed to ensure the gigabit connection is active .

Important Considerations

- o Direct Fiber to Router: Only possible if the router has a dedicated SFP port for fiber, which is uncommon in most home routers .
- o Router Compatibility: Routers designed for DSL or cable connections will not work with fiber. Look for "fiber-ready" or GPON-compatible routers .
- o Optimal Performance: Avoid bending fiber cables, place the router centrally for Wi-Fi coverage, and enable security features like WPA3 . By following these steps, a gigabit router can fully leverage the high-speed, low-latency benefits of fiber optic internet while distributing it efficiently throughout your home or office.
