

Can cables be connected inside cable trays

Types of Cables Suitable for Cable Trays

Cable trays are designed to support a variety of cables, including:

- o Power Cables (Type TC): Used for industrial power or control circuits, rated for 600 volts, and suitable for installation in cable trays, raceways, or outdoor locations with proper support .
- o Control Cables: Facilitate communication and control in systems like HVAC, connecting sensors, thermostats, and control panels .
- o Ethernet Cables: Must meet fire and performance ratings such as CMR, CMP, or tray-rated for PoE devices and network infrastructure .
- o Fiber Optic Cables: Installed in trays for high-speed backbone connections, requiring careful planning to maintain signal integrity .
- o Instrumentation Tray Cables (ITC/PLTC): Used for low-voltage instrumentation and control circuits, available in shielded or unshielded forms, and must be continuously supported and secured every six feet .

Installation Guidelines

- o Tray Types: Ladder, solid-bottom, ventilated trough, wire mesh, and channel trays are available, each providing different levels of support, ventilation, and protection .
- o Securing Cables: Use cable ties, cleats, or straps to organize cables, prevent stress on terminations, and maintain separation by voltage or signal type .
- o Bends and Drop-Outs: Use horizontal and vertical bends, tees, and drop-outs to route cables safely to equipment .
- o Tray Fill Limits: Adhere to NEC Article 392 fill rules to prevent overheating and allow maintenance access .
- o Grounding and Bonding: Metallic trays must be electrically continuous, properly bonded at all splice points, and connected to the building's grounding system to ensure safety .

Best Practices

- o Maintain minimum bend radius for cables exiting trays to avoid damage .
 - o Ensure proper spacing and support to prevent sagging or mechanical stress .
 - o Select tray material and finish based on environmental conditions, such as aluminum for corrosion resistance .
