An Optical Line Terminal (OLT) is the central device in a point-to-multipoint or passive optical network (PON), connecting multiple subscribers via fiber-optic links. A 1G OLT typically supports 1 Gbps downstream and upstream connections, making it suitable for residential, enterprise, and triple-play services including high-speed internet, voice, and video . These devices are designed to scale efficiently, supporting multiple optical network units (ONUs) or terminals (ONTs) from a single location .

- o GPON (Gigabit Passive Optical Network): ITU-T G.984.x, supporting 2.5 Gbps downstream and 1.25 Gbps upstream per PON interface .
- o EPON (Ethernet PON): IEEE 802.3ah, providing Ethernet-based gigabit connectivity .
- o OCT Standard v4: Ensures interoperability, synchronized acquisition, and proper modulation for optical communications . Certification ensures that the OLT can interoperate with compliant ONTs/ONUs, perform remote management, and maintain quality of service (QoS) across the network .
