

Checking how many devices are using the fiber optic router

You can see all devices connected to your fiber optic router by logging into the router's web interface, using command-line tools, or employing network scanning apps.

Using the Router's Web Interface

Most fiber optic routers allow you to view connected devices through their admin panel. To do this:

- o Find your router's IP address (commonly 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1) from the router label, manual, or by checking your device's network settings .
- o Open a web browser and enter the IP address.
- o Log in with your admin username and password.
- o Navigate to sections labeled Connected Devices, Attached Devices, Client List, or DHCP Client Table. This will display each device's name, IP address, and MAC address .
- o Review the list to identify any unknown devices. If unauthorized devices are present, change your Wi-Fi password and use WPA2 or WPA3 encryption to secure your network .

Using Command-Line Tools

You can also check connected devices using your computer:

- o Windows: Open Command Prompt, type `arp -a`, and press Enter to see IP addresses of connected devices .
- o Mac/Linux: Open Terminal and type `arp -a` or `route -n` to list devices and their IPs . This method shows devices your router has communicated with recently.

Using Network Scanning Apps

Apps like Fing (iOS/Android) or Wireless Network Watcher (Windows) can scan your network and provide a detailed list of connected devices, including manufacturer and device type . Some router brands also offer dedicated mobile apps (e.g., TP-Link Tether, Google Home) to monitor connected devices in real time .

Additional Tips

- o Most consumer routers support 32-64 simultaneous connections, while Wi-Fi 6 routers can handle more efficiently .
- o Regularly monitoring connected devices helps maintain network performance and security.
- o If you notice frequent unknown connections, consider enabling MAC address filtering or upgrading your router for better device management .
