

Connecting the optical module and router using fiber optic cable

- o Align the key on the fiber connector with the SFP module slot.
- o Insert the fiber connector gently until it clicks or locks in place. If the module has a lock tab, push it down to secure the cable .
- o Ensure TX (transmit) on one device connects to RX (receive) on the other device to establish proper communication .

Step 5: Power On and Verify

- o Turn on the router and any connected devices.
- o Check the link LED indicators on the SFP module; a green light usually indicates a successful connection .
- o Optionally, use a power meter or visual fault locator to confirm proper signal transmission .

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Step 6: Secure and Maintain

- o Route the fiber cable to prevent bending or accidental disconnection.
- o Avoid touching the fiber ends and store any unused SFP modules in a static-free container . Following these steps ensures a reliable fiber optic connection between your SFP module and router, minimizing signal loss and hardware damage while maintaining optimal network performance .
