1. **Splice Plates and Bolted Connections** Flat metal splice plates with pre-drilled holes are used to join the ends of two tray sections. The cover plate is aligned over the tray and secured with bolts and nuts, creating a strong, reliable connection suitable for straight runs and long sections of cable tray. This method allows for disassembly if maintenance or modifications are needed, but requires tools such as spanners or torque wrenches and takes more installation time . 2. **Quick-Connect Systems** Some manufacturers provide snap, slide, or twist-fit systems that allow cover plates to be attached quickly with minimal tools. These systems are faster to install and reduce labor costs, but are often brand-specific and may have higher upfront costs . 3. **Clamps and Joint Plates** For certain tray widths, especially 400 mm or more, a joint plate is used to prevent transverse bending under load. The cover plate is clamped between connectors or fastened with truss-head bolts and combination nuts. For smaller widths (up to 300 mm), joint plates may be optional. Screws should be inserted from the inner side of the tray to avoid cable damage . 4. **Angle and Adjustable Connectors** When routing trays around corners or creating rises and drops, angle or adjustable connectors are used. Cover plates are attached in the same manner as straight sections, ensuring continuous protection and maintaining aesthetics .

- o **Alignment:** Ensure the cover plate is flush with the tray edges to prevent gaps that could expose cables.
- o **Fastener Selection:** Use the correct bolts, nuts, or clamps recommended by the tray manufacturer to maintain structural integrity.
- o **Safety:** Avoid over-tightening screws to prevent damage to cables or tray coating. Always follow manufacturer guidelines for torque and placement .
- o **Maintenance:** Connections should allow for easy removal of cover plates for cable inspection or addition of new cables . By selecting the appropriate connection method based on tray type, load, and installation speed, you can ensure a durable, safe, and professional cable tray system.
