

# Creative ideas for covering up electrical boxes

- o Mini Garden Sheds or Outdoor Cabinets: Construct a small shed or cabinet that hides the box and provides extra storage for tools or garden supplies .
- o Sliding or Folding Panels: Install lightweight sliding panels on tracks or folding screens that can be moved instantly to access the box, keeping the required 36-inch clearance .
- o Curtains or Fabric Panels: Hang flame-resistant, lightweight fabric from a ceiling or wall track system, ensuring it does not touch the panel and can be moved quickly .

## Safety Considerations

- o Maintain a minimum 36-inch clearance in front of the panel and 30 inches wide, extending vertically to 6.5 feet, as required by the National Electric Code .

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- o Avoid flammable materials directly over the panel; use non-combustible or flame-resistant materials for any covering .
  - o Ensure all covers are easily removable or operable with one hand to allow immediate access in emergencies .
