Commercial and light industrial DB boxes may be wall-mounted or floor-standing, with higher amperage ratings (200A+) to accommodate modern electrical loads, EV chargers, and smart home systems . Outdoor or industrial DB boxes often feature high IP ratings (IP44-IP67) for weatherproofing, with dimensions adjusted for pre-wired or retrofit installations . Typical industrial wall-mounted DB boxes are designed for easy mounting and sufficient internal space for bus bars, breakers, and wiring.
