- o Sufficient capacity to manage multiple devices and high bandwidth demands, especially in households with many connected devices . Older routers may struggle with fiber speeds, leading to reduced performance or Wi-Fi dead zones. In such cases, upgrading to a fiber-compatible router is recommended to unlock the full potential of your connection .

When a New Router Is Recommended

You should consider replacing your router if:

- o It is outdated or more than 4-5 years old .
- o You experience slow speeds, unreliable connections, or Wi-Fi dead zones .
- o You want to take advantage of symmetrical upload and download speeds offered by fiber . Many ISPs provide a compatible router during fiber installation, which can simplify setup and ensure optimal performance .
