

Does the switch support optical output

The built-in optical S/PDIF audio output allows external sound extraction to AV receivers or soundbars, giving you full flexibility in audio routing. - At least the Switch supports USB DACs / soundcards, some apparently with optical outputs, but apparently none of them do anything better than stereo. Am I missing something or is there really no way to get any surround format on optical out of Nintendo's latest two systems? Thanks! by bobrocks95. Edit: My Westinghouse TV has an option to switch from PCM or RAW sound output. It also doesn't have a disable TV speakers setting as I mentioned. New comments cannot be posted and votes cannot be cast. Could you go hdmi -> Logitech -> tv? Users can easily expand storage space using microSDHC or microSDXC cards up to 2TB (sold separately). Used for charging or for connecting to the Nintendo Switch dock. *Once the microSDXC card is inserted, a system update will be necessary. 1 LPCM / Multichannel PCM instead of Dolby for surround audio which causes compatibility issues with most of the audio devices in the market.

Does the Switch support DisplayPort? When you connect the Nintendo Switch to the dock, a chip within the latter receives the DisplayPort and audio feed and converts it all to HDMI using the older Mobility

To get surround off of the Nintendo Switch on Sonos, you'll need a device between the two that can convert the linear PCM 5.1 audio into Dolby Digital 5.1 and output it on the optical connection to your

Information With the TV's power off, make sure that the optical cable is securely inserted in both your TV and audio receiver. After completing the previous step, turn your TV on using the power

You can check if your devices support TOSLINK audio cabling by looking on the back of the device for the distinct TOSLINK port. The port is typically labeled "optical audio", "TOSLINK",
