

Fiber optic cable core through conduit

Article Overview

Fiber optic cables should be run through properly sized and prepared conduit to protect the delicate glass or plastic core from physical stress, moisture, and environmental damage.

Purpose of Conduit

Conduit serves as a protective pathway for fiber optic cables, shielding the fragile core from crushing, abrasion, moisture, pests, and accidental damage during construction or excavation . It also simplifies maintenance, allowing damaged cables to be replaced or upgraded without re-excavating the entire route . Using conduit ensures long-term reliability and future-proofing, as it can accommodate multiple cables or next-generation fiber standards .

Conduit Selection

- o **Materials:** High-Density Polyethylene (HDPE) is preferred for underground runs due to its flexibility and durability, while PVC is suitable for exposed or wall-mounted installations. Fiberglass may be used where high compressive strength or chemical resistance is required .
- o **Size:** Conduit must be sized to allow smooth cable pulling without exceeding tension limits. Innerducts, smaller tubes within the main conduit, can separate individual fiber runs and reduce friction .
- o **Fill Ratio:** Maintain a maximum of 40% initial fill to keep pulling tension manageable and allow future cable additions .

Installation Considerations

- o **Bend Radius:** Fiber optic cables have strict minimum bend radii. Avoid sharp turns and 90-degree elbows; use long-radius sweeps or factory pre-bent fittings .
- o **Pulling Techniques:** Attach the cable to a pre-installed pull string using a swivel pulling eye and apply force only to the cable's strength members, not the outer jacket or fibers . Lubricants compatible with fiber jackets, such as water-based or gel-based products, reduce friction during long runs .
- o **Debris and Moisture:** Clear the conduit of burrs, dirt, and moisture before pulling the cable. Seal exposed ends with plugs or end caps to prevent contamination .
- o **Pull Points:** Install pull boxes or handholes at every major direction change and at intervals along long straight runs to reduce tension and facilitate maintenance .

Depth and Protection

When buried, conduit allows fiber optic cables to be installed at shallower depths (as little as 18 inches) compared to direct burial, while still providing protection from rodents, rocks, and moisture . For direct burial



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without conduit, armored cables are recommended, but conduit remains advantageous for future upgrades and easier cable replacement .
