



Fiber optic cable directly connected to the wireless router

Article Overview

You cannot plug a fiber optic cable directly into a standard wireless router; it must first connect to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts the optical signal into an Ethernet signal for the router.

Required Equipment

- o Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Provided by your ISP, this device converts the fiber optic signal into an electrical signal compatible with routers .
- o Fiber optic cable: Usually a thin yellow cable with SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors .
- o Ethernet cable: Typically Cat6 or higher to connect the ONT to the router .
- o Wireless router: Ensure it has a WAN/Internet port and supports the speeds provided by your fiber connection .

Step-by-Step Connection

- o Locate the fiber wall outlet where the ISP's fiber line enters your home.
- o Connect the fiber optic cable to the ONT: Remove protective caps, align the connector, and insert it until it clicks securely .
- o Power on the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize, indicating a successful connection to the ISP network .
- o Connect the ONT to the router: Use an Ethernet cable from the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN/Internet port .
- o Power on the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm connectivity.
- o Configure the router: Access the router's admin panel via a web browser (commonly 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1) and enter ISP credentials if required .
- o Set up Wi-Fi: Follow the router's setup wizard to configure SSID, password, and security settings.
- o Test the connection: Connect a device via Wi-Fi or Ethernet and run a speed test to verify performance .

Tips for Optimal Performance

- o Place the ONT and router in a dry, ventilated area near power outlets .
- o Use high-quality Ethernet cables (Cat6a or higher) to maintain gigabit speeds .
- o Update router firmware to ensure security and performance .
- o If the connection fails, reboot the ONT and router or contact your ISP for troubleshooting . By following these steps, your fiber optic internet will be properly converted and distributed through your wireless router, providing high-speed, low-latency connectivity throughout your home or office.
