- o Test the Connection: Verify the repair using OTDR or power meter tests to ensure signal integrity .
- o Protect the Splice: Apply protective sleeves or enclosures and re-bury or secure the cable to prevent future damage .

- o Proper Installation: Maintain adequate bending radius and avoid high-traffic areas .
- o Regular Maintenance: Inspect cables periodically for wear, microbends, or environmental damage .
