- o Plan the unplugging process to avoid disrupting active services.
 - o Route cords neatly and avoid temporary setups that could stress the fiber .
 - o Label both ends of the patch cord to maintain traceability and prevent mis-patching .
 - o Use appropriate tools and cable management frames to protect the cord during handling .
