Common features include wall-mounted or rack-mounted designs, IP65 protection for outdoor use, and compatibility with various fiber adapters like SC, LC, ST, and FC . 2. Optical Distribution Frames (ODFs) ODFs are larger-scale mounting structures designed to organize and manage high-density fiber cabling in central locations such as data centers or telecom rooms. They allow for efficient patching, routing, and maintenance of multiple fiber connections . 3. Fiber Connectors and Termini Fiber optic termini consist of precision components like ferrules (ceramic, metal, or plastic) that align and secure the fiber end within a connector. Common connector types include SC (snap-in), LC (small form-factor), ST (bayonet-style), FC (screw-on), and MTP/MPO (multi-fiber) for high-density applications .
