

Finished cable tray length

Article Overview

Standard finished cable tray dimensions vary by type, with widths from 50mm to 900mm, depths from 50mm to 150mm, and lengths typically 3 meters, designed to accommodate cable fill, heat dissipation, and structural load requirements.

Standard Widths and Depths

Cable tray widths are selected based on the number and size of cables to be installed. Common widths range from 50mm for small data lines to 900mm for large industrial power runs. Depths (side rail height) typically range from 50mm to 150mm, ensuring cables are held securely and allowing proper airflow for heat dissipation. Wider trays improve airflow and ease of cable pulling, while deeper trays increase vertical stacking capacity but may not always be the most efficient for airflow or installation .

Typical Lengths

Cable trays are manufactured in straight sections for ease of transport and installation. Standard lengths are 3 meters (10 feet), though some manufacturers offer lengths up to 12 meters (40 feet) for long-span outdoor installations. Shorter spans are supported every 6-8 feet indoors, while longer spans may require supports every 14-20 feet depending on load and environmental conditions .

Material Thickness

Material thickness affects load capacity, allowable span, and long-term durability. Steel trays are strongest and suitable for heavy power cables, while aluminum trays are lighter but may require closer support spacing. Typical thickness ranges vary by tray type and load requirements, with ladder trays generally requiring thicker side rails for heavy loads .

Tray Types and Dimensional Considerations

- o Ladder trays: Prioritize width, side rail height, and thickness for heavy loads; rung spacing typically 6-18 inches depending on cable type .
- o Perforated trays: Balance containment with ventilation; usable area slightly reduced due to perforations .
- o Channel trays: Compact, light-duty applications; limited width and depth .
- o Wire mesh trays: Flexible and fast to install; trade structural capacity for speed .

Cable Fill and Safety

Cable trays should be filled to no more than 40% of usable area to prevent overheating and allow airflow.



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Usable area is calculated as inside width x usable depth, and tray selection should be based on actual cable diameters, not conductor size alone. By considering these dimensions, tray type, and cable fill requirements, you can select a finished cable tray that is code-compliant, structurally sound, and future-ready.

The standard lengths for cable trays are 10, 12, 20 and 24 feet - up to 40 foot lengths are available (consult B-Line for the availability)
