

Article Overview

Communication Equipment Rooms must meet strict requirements for space, environmental control, electrical safety, and cabling to ensure reliable operation and maintenance of network infrastructure.

Room Location and Layout

Communication Equipment Rooms should be centrally located within a building to minimize cable lengths and facilitate network distribution. They must be physically protected from water, steam, and other building services that could damage equipment. Rooms should allow safe access for installation, maintenance, and future expansion, with a minimum clearance of 1.2 meters around equipment and patch panels set between 1 and 2.5 meters in height for ergonomic access .

Space and Sizing

Room dimensions depend on the area served:

- o $\leq 460 \text{ m}^2$: 3m x 2.4m
- o 460-740 m^2 : 3m x 2.74m
- o 740-929 m^2 : 3m x 3.4m Ceiling height should allow for conduits and cable trays, typically ending at 2.4m above finished floor . A minimum of one Communications Unit per 1000 m^2 of floor space is recommended, with at least one unit per floor .

Environmental Requirements

- o Temperature and humidity must be controlled to protect sensitive electronics.
- o Lighting should be sufficient for safe installation and maintenance, not lower than standard office levels.
- o Fire safety: walls, floors, and backboards should use fire-retardant materials, and rooms should comply with local fire codes .

Electrical and Cabling Standards

- o Electrical installations must follow IET Wiring Regulations or equivalent national standards.
- o Cabling should be installed to allow future expansion, with clear pathways and proper labeling.
- o Patch panels and racks should be arranged to facilitate efficient airflow and heat dissipation .

Compliance and Guidance

GB Communication Equipment Room Construction Standards

In the UK, Approved Document R provides guidance for electronic communications infrastructure in buildings, including new constructions and major renovations. It emphasizes physical protection, accessibility, and compliance with building regulations. While GB standards in China may have specific numeric requirements, the principles of space allocation, environmental control, electrical safety, and cabling management are consistent with international best practices.
