Overview of a Distribution Box

A distribution box, also called a consumer unit, fuse board, or panel board, is the central hub for distributing electricity throughout a home. It receives power from the utility or main transformer and divides it into multiple circuits for lighting, sockets, and high-power appliances (). The main components include:

- o Main Switch (Double Pole MCB): Controls the entire electrical system and allows complete shutdown for maintenance or emergencies ().
- o Circuit Breakers (Single Pole or Double Pole MCBs): Protect individual circuits from overloads and short circuits ().
- o Residual Current Devices (RCCB/RCD): Provide protection against electric shocks and leakage currents ().
- o Neutral and Earth Bars: Distribute neutral and grounding connections to all circuits ().

Wiring Connections

In a typical single-phase home distribution box:

- o Incoming Supply: The live (phase) and neutral wires from the utility meter connect to the main MCB.
- o Main MCB to RCCB: The output of the main MCB feeds the RCCB, which monitors leakage currents.
- o RCCB to Output MCBs: The RCCB output connects to individual MCBs for each circuit, such as room sockets, lighting, or high-power appliances ().
- o Neutral and Earth Links: Neutral wires from each circuit connect to the neutral bar, and earth wires connect to the earth bar to ensure safety ().

Types of Distribution Boards

- o Main Distribution Board (MDB): Receives incoming supply and houses the main protective devices ().
- o Sub Distribution Board (SDB): Distributes power to specific areas or floors in a building ().
- o Final Distribution Board (FDB): Supplies electricity to final circuits like lights, fans, and appliances ().

Safety Considerations

- o Ensure overload and short-circuit protection for all circuits ().
- o Use RCCBs for socket circuits to prevent electric shocks ().

- o Maintain proper earthing and insulation to avoid hazards.
- o Follow IP ratings for moisture protection in kitchens, bathrooms, or outdoor installations ().

- o Label each MCB clearly to identify the circuit it controls.
- o Keep wiring neat and organized to simplify troubleshooting.
- o Always turn off the main supply before performing any work inside the distribution box (). A well-wired distribution box ensures efficient, safe, and reliable electricity distribution throughout the home, protecting both appliances and occupants from electrical hazards ().
