The junction box should be securely mounted to a structural element and covered with a solid faceplate to prevent accidental contact . For wires running along the surface, consider wire molding, cable raceways, or conduit to protect the conductors and maintain a neat installation .

- o Ensure proper grounding and correct wire gauge for each circuit.
- o Use UL/CE-certified components and follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC) for installation .
- o Schedule regular inspections to detect wear, degradation, or rodent damage early .
- o Avoid temporary fixes like electrical tape alone for long-term protection, especially in high-load or outdoor circuits .
