

How is the cost of fiber optic cable usage calculated

o Determine Cable Length and Type

o Example: 2,000 ft of single-mode outdoor cable.

o Calculate Material Cost



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- o Cable: $2,000 \text{ ft} \times \$0.70/\text{ft} = \$1,400$.
- o Add Labor Costs
- o Labor: $2,000 \text{ ft} \times \$1.60/\text{ft} = \$3,200$.
- o Include Permits and Accessories
- o Permits: \$350, Accessories: \$250.
- o Total Estimated Cost
- o Total = $\$1,400 + \$3,200 + \$350 + \$250 = \$5,200$.
