

How long should a fiber optic patch cord be stripped

A fiber optic patch cord is typically stripped to expose about 1 to 2 inches (25-50 mm) of the fiber for connector termination, depending on the connector type.

Standard Stripping Guidelines

The exact length of fiber to strip depends on the connector type and the termination method:

- o LC, SC, and ST connectors: Usually require stripping about 1 to 1.5 inches (25-38 mm) of the outer jacket to expose the buffered fiber for proper insertion into the ferrule and adhesive application.
- o MTP/MPO connectors: Often require slightly longer stripping, around 1.5 to 2 inches (38-50 mm), to accommodate multiple fibers and alignment within the connector housing.
- o Buffer and coating removal: After stripping the outer jacket, the primary buffer coating (typically 900 um) is removed to expose the bare glass fiber, usually leaving about 10-15 mm of bare fiber for polishing or cleaving.

Best Practices

- o Avoid over-stripping: Exposing too much fiber increases the risk of breakage and contamination, which can lead to signal loss or connector damage.
- o Use proper tools: Fiber strippers designed for the specific fiber diameter (250 um or 900 um) ensure clean, precise stripping without nicking the glass.
- o Clean thoroughly: After stripping, clean the fiber with lint-free wipes and isopropyl alcohol to remove debris and prevent insertion loss.
- o Follow manufacturer specifications: Each connector type may have slightly different requirements for jacket and buffer stripping lengths, so always consult the connector datasheet.

Summary

For most single-mode and multimode patch cords, stripping 1-2 inches of the outer jacket and leaving 10-15 mm of bare fiber is standard practice. Proper stripping ensures reliable connector termination, minimizes insertion loss, and maintains long-term network performance .
