- o **Portable Units:** Modern sites often use portable distribution cabinets with waterproof connectors to handle harsh conditions and frequent layout changes .
- o **Specialized Units:** Some boxes are designed for specific voltages (e.g., 230 V single-phase for lighting, 400 V three-phase for heavy machinery) and may include multiple socket types .
