- o Sockets and plug connections for three-phase and single-phase equipment (e.g., CEE 16 A, 32 A, 63 A, and 230 V outlets).
- o Internal transformers for control circuits (e.g., 110 V or 400 V auxiliary supply).
- o Feeder-in points for emergency generators or backup power systems.
- o Compartmentalized sections for different trades or zones to allow safe isolation and maintenance . The number of units--meaning individual breakers, sockets, or compartments--depends on the load profile and simultaneity factors. For example, a site with multiple high-power machines may require more breakers and larger capacity sockets, while a smaller site may have fewer units. Typically, an MDB on a medium-sized construction site may include 10-30 individual units, but this can vary widely based on the number of sub-distributions, phases, and safety margins planned .

Design Considerations

- o IP55 protection class is recommended to protect against dust and water jets, ensuring durability in harsh construction environments .
- o Phase balancing is important to prevent neutral overloading when distributing single-phase loads.
- o Reserve margin of 20-30% is often included to accommodate peak loads or additional equipment during construction phases .
- o Stage expansion allows the MDB to be upgraded or decommissioned in line with construction progress.
