

How to connect a 24-core optical cable to a flange

Use a 24-fiber MPO/MTP connector to terminate the cable, then secure it to the flange using proper alignment and polishing techniques for reliable optical performance.

Step 1: Prepare the Cable

Begin by carefully stripping the outer jacket of the 24-core fiber optic cable using a precision stripping tool. Expose the inner fibers while avoiding damage to the delicate glass cores. Clean each fiber with a specialized fiber cleaning solution and rods to remove dust or contaminants, which is critical for maintaining signal quality .

Step 2: Choose the Appropriate Connector

For a 24-core cable, a 24-fiber MPO/MTP connector is recommended. These connectors are designed for high-density applications and can handle multiple fibers in a single ferrule. MPO connectors come in male (with pins) and female (without pins) versions, and the correct type must be used to match the flange or equipment port . Ensure the connector is keyed correctly to maintain proper fiber polarity.

Align the 24 fibers precisely within the MPO ferrule. Use a fixture or adhesive to stabilize the fibers in place. For permanent connections, a fusion splicer can be used to join the fibers to pigtails or directly to the MPO connector, ensuring minimal signal loss . After splicing, polish the fiber ends to achieve a smooth, flat surface for optimal optical transmission.

Step 4: Mount the Connector to the Flange

Once the MPO connector is prepared, insert it into the flange port. Ensure the connector clicks or locks securely, maintaining proper alignment. The flange may have a specific orientation or keying system to prevent misalignment. Double-check that the first fiber position (often marked with a white dot) matches the corresponding port on the flange .

Step 5: Test the Connection

After installation, use an optical power meter or optical time-domain reflectometer (OTDR) to verify the connection quality. Check for insertion loss, return loss, and continuity across all 24 fibers to ensure the connection meets performance standards .

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Additional Tips

- o Maintain a clean, dust-free environment during installation.
- o Wear ESD gloves to prevent static damage to fibers.
- o Avoid bending the cable beyond its minimum bend radius to prevent signal degradation.
- o Use MPO-to-LC breakout cables if the flange requires duplex connections for individual fibers . By following these steps, a 24-core optical cable can be securely and efficiently connected to a flange, ensuring high-density, low-loss optical performance suitable for modern high-speed networks.
