

How to connect a fiber optic main line to a router

To connect a fiber optic mainline to a router, you must first use an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the fiber signal to Ethernet, then link the ONT to your router via an Ethernet cable.

Step 1: Gather Necessary Equipment

- o Power on the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize, which may take a few minutes .

Step 3: Connect the ONT to Your Router

- o Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN or Internet port .
- o Power on the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm a successful connection .

Step 4: Configure and Test

- o Access your router's configuration interface via a web browser (commonly 192.168.0.1 or 192.168.1.1) to verify connectivity .
- o Enable Quality of Service (QoS) if needed for VoIP or video streaming .
- o Test the connection speed and stability to ensure the fiber link is performing optimally .

Safety and Handling Tips

- o Always remove protective caps from fiber connectors before connecting .
- o Avoid bending the fiber cable sharply or exposing it to dust and moisture .
- o Place both the ONT and router in a dry, ventilated area near power outlets, ideally with surge protection . By following these steps, you ensure a reliable, high-speed fiber optic connection from the mainline to your router, leveraging the full performance of your fiber internet service .
