

How to install cable tray bends on site

Cable tray bend supports are installed by marking support points, securing brackets at proper intervals, and using pre-fabricated or adjustable bends to maintain structural integrity and cable safety.

Step 1: Plan and Mark the Bend Path

Before installing bend supports, determine the route of the cable tray and identify all locations where bends, tees, or elevation changes occur. Use a chalk line or laser level to mark the path on the wall, ceiling, or floor, and mark the support points at standard intervals, typically every 1.5 meters (5 feet), or according to the manufacturer's specifications for your tray type and load .

Step 2: Select the Appropriate Bend and Support

Choose between pre-fabricated bends (e.g., 30°, 45°, 60°, 90°) or adjustable bends that can be set on-site. Ladder trays often use PKP-KO 0-90° adjustable bends for flexibility, while ventilated troughs may require custom-fabricated bends . Ensure the bend type matches the tray material and cable load.

Step 3: Install Mounting Brackets

Secure mounting brackets or wall arms at the marked support points. For ceiling or wall installations, use threaded rods and anchor bolts for stability. Ensure brackets are level and aligned with the tray path. For bends, place additional supports near the start and end of the bend to prevent sagging and maintain proper cable spacing .

Step 4: Attach the Bend to the Tray

- o Pre-fabricated bends: Connect the bend to the straight tray sections using splice plates or couplers, tightening bolts securely.
- o Adjustable bends: Adjust the angle to match the desired path, then secure with bolts and clamps.
- o On-site fabricated bends: If bending steel trays manually, use a metal bar or bending tool to form the bend, then reinforce with support brackets at both ends and along the curve .

Step 5: Verify Alignment and Support

Check that the bend is properly aligned with the rest of the tray system and that all supports are secure and level. Ensure the bend does not create sharp edges that could damage cables. Install grounding straps if required to maintain electrical continuity .

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Step 6: Final Inspection

After installation, inspect the entire bend section for structural integrity, proper spacing, and compliance with NEC or local electrical codes. Confirm that the cable tray fill ratio is within limits and that cables can be pulled through the bend without obstruction. By following these steps, you ensure that cable tray bends are secure, code-compliant, and capable of safely supporting the routed cables.
