

How to install concealed circuits in a distribution box

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powering on .

- o Fill wall grooves with plaster or cement to fully conceal conduits and wiring .
- o Label circuits for easier future maintenance and troubleshooting .

- o Always turn off the main power supply before starting installation .
- o Follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC) and use certified components.
- o Ensure proper ventilation, dry placement, and accessible height (typically ~1.5m) for the DB .
