

How to install low-voltage cable trays into server racks

Install low-voltage cable trays in server racks by planning the route, selecting the right tray type, securing proper support, and maintaining separation from power circuits.

Step 1: Plan the Cable Tray Route

Before installation, review approved shop drawings showing the tray route, dimensions, installation height, and the number of layers. Ensure the path avoids interference with HVAC ducts, fire suppression pipes, and other services. Maintain a vertical separation of at least 30 cm between low-voltage trays and electrical power trays to prevent electromagnetic interference . Mark the route on the rack and surrounding area for precise alignment .

Step 2: Select the Appropriate Tray Type

For low-voltage cabling, basket trays or ventilated trough trays are recommended. Basket trays provide flexibility, easy cable entry, and good airflow, which is ideal for structured cabling systems like Ethernet or fiber optics . Ladder trays are more suitable for power cables but can be used if additional support is needed.

Step 3: Determine Tray Size and Load

Calculate the tray width and depth based on the number of cables, their diameter, and spacing requirements. Cable fill should not exceed 40% of tray capacity to prevent overheating and allow future expansion . Ensure the tray can support the weight of the cables without sagging.

Step 4: Install Supports and Mounting

Secure the tray to the server rack or nearby structural supports using brackets, clamps, or threaded rods. Support spacing typically ranges from 1.5 to 3 meters, depending on tray type and load . Ensure trays are level and aligned to prevent cable stress. For multi-layer installations, maintain proper vertical clearance between layers.

Step 5: Lay and Secure Cables

Route cables carefully through the tray, avoiding sharp bends and excessive tension. Use cable ties or Velcro straps at regular intervals to secure cables without compressing them. Label cables clearly for maintenance and troubleshooting . For long runs, consider using cable tray rollers to prevent kinks.

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Step 6: Grounding and Bonding

Even for low-voltage trays, ensure proper grounding and bonding according to local electrical codes. This prevents potential electrical hazards and ensures compliance with standards .

Step 7: Final Checks

Inspect the installation for alignment, secure mounting, proper separation from power circuits, and correct cable fill. Verify that all cables are labeled and accessible for future maintenance . Conduct a final walkthrough with the project engineer if required. By following these steps, you can achieve a safe, organized, and code-compliant low-voltage cable tray installation in a server rack, ensuring efficient cable management and long-term reliability.
