

How to install protective tubing on optical cables

Types of Protective Tubing

1. Conduits: Conduits are rigid or flexible channels that house optical cables, shielding them from moisture, dust, rodents, and physical stress. They are essential for outdoor installations and areas with high mechanical risk. Conduits also facilitate cable management and future maintenance or upgrades. Proper sizing and pre-lubrication are important to prevent cable damage during installation, especially for pre-terminated assemblies . 2. Plastic and Reinforced Tubes: Plastic tubes, including reinforced variants, are commonly used for multi-fiber loose tube cables with fanout elements. They protect fibers from longitudinal and transverse forces and environmental factors. These tubes are suitable for both installation and maintenance, providing mechanical protection while allowing proper handling of the fibers . 3. Flexible Protective Covers (Helawrap/HWPE2): Helawrap is a highly flexible polyethylene cover with slits, allowing it to bend and conform to curved or moving parts. It can be retrofitted over existing optical cables and is ideal for vibrating or moving components. This type of tubing reduces installation effort and provides additional protection against abrasion and mechanical stress .

Considerations for Selection

- o Outdoor vs. Indoor Use: Loose tube cables in outdoor environments benefit from conduits or reinforced tubes to withstand temperature extremes, water ingress, and mechanical forces. Indoor/outdoor cables may also require UV protection and water-blocking features .
- o Mechanical Stress: Avoid sharp bends, edges, and excessive pulling tension. Use figure-8 loops during installation to prevent twisting and microbending .
- o Environmental Protection: For outdoor installations, select tubing that provides water-blocking, UV resistance, and protection against rodents or chemical exposure .
- o Flexibility and Maintenance: Flexible covers like Helawrap allow easy retrofitting and maintenance without disassembling the cable assembly .

For optimal protection of optical fiber cables, use conduits for outdoor and high-risk areas, reinforced or plastic tubes for mechanical protection of multi-fiber assemblies, and flexible covers like Helawrap for moving or vibrating parts.
