 - o **Cable Trays, Baskets, and Raceways:** Secure cables along walls, floors, or ceilings, protecting them from dust, moisture, and strain .
 - o **Velcro or Reusable Cable Ties:** Bundle cables neatly without damaging them, allowing easy adjustments .
- Maintain Proper Bend Radius:** Avoid sharp bends in power cables to prevent stress and potential failure. Cable managers and D-rings help maintain consistent bend radii, especially for longer runs . **Label Cables:** Clearly label each power cable using wrap-around, heat-shrink, or self-laminating labels. This reduces troubleshooting time and prevents accidental disconnections . **Optimize Airflow:** Organized cables allow hot air to exhaust and cool air to circulate, reducing equipment temperatures by 10-20°C in home setups and preventing overheating in professional racks . **Avoid running cables across ventilation paths.** **Plan for Future Growth:** Allocate extra space in cable managers and leave slack for future devices. Avoid excessive cable lengths that create clutter or tension . **Safety Considerations:** Properly secured power cables reduce tripping hazards, prevent accidental unplugging, and comply with fire safety codes . Use cord grips or glands at equipment entry points to prevent strain.
