

How to protect roof cable trays

Article Overview

Effective protection of roof cable trays involves secure, non-penetrative supports, proper separation of circuits, and adherence to safety standards to prevent hazards and roof damage.

Safe Support Systems

Cable trays on rooftops should not be laid directly on the roof surface, especially on delicate single-ply membrane roofs, as this can cause leaks, ponding, and compromise roof warranties (Specifier Review), . Modern best practice recommends non-penetrative support systems that elevate trays above the roof, allowing water drainage and reducing trip hazards. These supports provide a stable, neat, and secure solution while protecting both the cabling and the roof structure (BEAMA), .

Separation and Circuit Protection

For life-safety or critical circuits, primary and secondary cable trays should be separated to maintain circuit independence. A 300 mm horizontal air-gap is commonly adopted in the UK to comply with BS 7671, BS 8519, and BS 5839 standards, ensuring that a failure in one circuit does not affect the other (Project Design), . Where routes converge, fire compartmentation with a survival time of ≥ 120 minutes is recommended for critical circuits.

Material and Environmental Considerations

Cable support systems are typically made from steel or stainless steel, often with galvanization or other corrosion protection to withstand weather and mechanical loads (OBO CMS), . Components include trays, ladders, mesh trays, fittings, and mounting elements, allowing for horizontal and vertical routing, bends, crossovers, and end closures. Proper material selection ensures durability and long-term protection against environmental exposure.

Installation Best Practices

- o Elevate trays to allow cables to exit from the bottom and prevent water accumulation.
- o Avoid using concrete slabs or cut-down struts directly on the roof, as they can damage membranes and create trip hazards.
- o Use tested and compatible system components to ensure mechanical stability and safety for personnel (BEAMA), .
- o Plan routing carefully to minimize interference with other rooftop equipment and maintain safe access for maintenance.
