

How to replace the fiber optic drop cable

Replacing a fiber optic drop cable involves careful planning, selecting the correct cable type, routing, termination, and testing to ensure reliable service.

Step 1: Assess the Existing Installation

Before replacing the drop cable, inspect the current setup. Identify the distribution terminal (Fiber Access Terminal or FAT) and the subscriber's Optical Network Unit (ONU). Check for any damaged connectors, seized ports, or environmental hazards that may affect the new installation .

Step 2: Select the Appropriate Cable

Use a G.657.A2 bend-insensitive fiber for drop cables, as it handles tight bends without significant signal loss . Choose the correct jacket type:

- o LSZH (Low Smoke Zero Halogen) for indoor routing
- o Outdoor/Indoor rated if the cable enters a building from outside
- o Figure-8 self-supporting if aerial installation is required .

Step 3: Plan the Route

Conduct a site survey to determine the optimal path from the FAT to the subscriber. Consider obstacles like HVAC ducts, steel beams, or tight corners. Leave slack loops at both ends to accommodate temperature-induced fiber movement and future maintenance .

Step 4: Remove the Old Cable

Carefully disconnect the old drop cable from the FAT and ONU. If the cable is spliced, you may need to reassign or re-splice the fiber to a new port . Avoid bending or stressing the fiber during removal.

Step 5: Install the New Cable

Depending on the installation method:

- o Direct aerial installation: Secure the cable to poles or messenger wires.
- o Duct or conduit installation: Pull or blow the cable through the conduit using proper tension monitoring .
- o Pushable microcables: Can be manually or mechanically pushed for short runs . Ensure the cable is properly clamped at entry points and avoid sharp bends.

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Step 6: Terminate and Splice

- o Use pre-terminated connectors if available to reduce labor and minimize signal loss.
- o For splicing, use a fusion splicer to join fibers with minimal attenuation.
- o Ensure all terminations are clean and properly polished .

Step 7: Test the Installation

After installation, test the fiber using an OTDR (Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer) or power meter to measure loss and verify signal integrity. Document the results for future reference .

Step 8: Finalize and Secure

Secure the cable along its route, label both ends, and ensure the installation complies with local building codes and safety standards. Restore service to the subscriber and monitor for any performance issues. By following these steps, you can replace a fiber optic drop cable safely and efficiently while maintaining network reliability and minimizing service disruption .
