

How to use wiring in a distribution box

- o Circuit Breakers: Install breakers in the designated slots. Connect each outgoing circuit wire to its corresponding breaker, ensuring the wire gauge matches the load.
- o Neat Cable Management: Arrange wires neatly, leaving enough space for heat dissipation. Use cable ties or DIN rails if available.
- o Labeling: Clearly mark each wire and breaker to identify the connected circuit for future maintenance.

Testing and Verification

After wiring, use a multimeter to check for continuity, correct voltage, and absence of short circuits. Ensure all connections are tight and properly insulated. Only power on the system after confirming all safety checks.

- o Schedule regular inspections to check for loose connections or damaged insulation.
- o Replace any faulty breakers or wires immediately.
