

Installation Requirements for Extension Cables in Distribution Boxes

Mounting and Wiring

- o Mark and drill holes for mounting the distribution box if adding a subpanel or extension. Use expansion bolts to secure the box, keeping it level and stable. For outdoor installations, select a waterproof box and add a rain cover ().
- o Strip the insulation from the extension cables to the required length, ensuring the exposed conductor is neither too long nor too short.
- o Connect the cables to the appropriate terminals: phase wire to phase terminal, neutral wire to neutral terminal, and ground wire to ground terminal. Ensure tight connections for good conductivity ().
- o Arrange and secure cables with zip ties, keeping them away from sharp edges and leaving space for heat dissipation.

Testing and Verification

- o Insulation resistance test: Use an insulation tester to check the insulation between wires and the box. The resistance should meet relevant standards ().
- o Circuit continuity and functionality: Use a multimeter to verify that each circuit is correctly connected and there are no short circuits or broken wires.
- o Final inspection: Ensure all breakers, fuses, and protective devices are correctly rated and installed. Only after passing all tests should the distribution box be energized ().

- o If the existing box is full, consider installing a subpanel or extending the main distribution board ().
- o Maintain ergonomic and neat cable arrangement to simplify future maintenance and reduce the risk of overheating ().
- o Always follow local electrical codes and standards, such as DIN VDE 0100 in Germany, or the relevant regulations in your country ().
