Multi-core armoured or flexible PVC cables are commonly used, with proper termination and protective devices .
- o **Accessibility and Maintenance:** Distribution boxes should be weatherproof, tamper-proof, and easily accessible for inspection and maintenance. Labeling circuits and performing visual and multimeter checks before energizing are recommended .

Compliance and Best Practices

- o Ensure that the installation is performed by a qualified electrician familiar with construction site requirements .
- o Use monitored-earth protection and specialized plugs and socket outlets to prevent accidental interchange with standard supplies .
- o Schedule regular inspections and maintenance to maintain long-term reliability and safety .
