Outdoor cable trays should be installed using corrosion-resistant materials, proper support spacing, and secure mounting to ensure safety, durability, and compliance with electrical standards.

Planning and Preparation

Before installation, plan the cable tray route carefully, considering clearance, load capacity, and separation from other utilities or hazards . Review approved shop drawings to determine tray layout, length, bends, and risers . Material Handling

Mounting Methods
