

Is it okay to put a splitter in a server rack

Article Overview

Using a power splitter in a server rack is possible but generally not recommended for critical servers due to redundancy and safety concerns.

Safety and Electrical Considerations

Power splitters can be used to distribute electricity to multiple devices, but the safety depends on the wire gauge, load, and type of equipment. For example, splitting power to multiple SSDs or low-power devices is usually safe if the cables are rated correctly (20-22 AWG for SSDs, 16-18 AWG for HDDs and GPUs) and the total current does not exceed the cable's capacity . Overloading a splitter or using undersized wires can create a fire hazard, especially with high-power devices.

Redundancy and Reliability

In server environments, redundancy is critical. Using a single power cable to feed multiple servers or devices creates a single point of failure, which can compromise uptime . Best practice is to connect each server to separate power supplies and UPS units, ideally on different circuits, to maintain redundancy and minimize risk of downtime.

Practical Use Cases

- o Low-power devices: Splitters can be acceptable for powering multiple SSDs or small peripherals within a server if the total load is low and cables are properly rated .
- o High-power servers: Avoid splitting power across multiple servers. Each server should have its own dedicated power feed to ensure reliability and maintain redundancy .
- o Server racks: Use PDUs (Power Distribution Units) designed for rack use, which can safely distribute power to multiple devices while maintaining proper load balancing and circuit protection .

Recommendations

- o Check the total load on the splitter and ensure it does not exceed the rated capacity.
- o Use appropriately rated cables for the devices being powered.
- o Prioritize redundancy: critical servers should have independent power feeds.
- o Consider PDUs for organized and safe power distribution in racks.
- o Avoid single points of failure by not connecting multiple servers to a single splitter or outlet.
