Video Bandwidth

The bandwidth of a KVM switch is crucial for video quality. For example, a 4K resolution at 60Hz typically requires sufficient bandwidth to transmit all pixel data without degradation. Higher bandwidth allows for higher resolutions, faster refresh rates, and better color fidelity. When selecting a KVM switch, ensure the switch's video interface matches your computers' outputs, or use a compatible converter if necessary (e.g., HDMI to DisplayPort) to maintain optimal performance .

USB and Peripheral Bandwidth

KVM switches also handle USB data for keyboards, mice, and other peripherals. USB 2.0 supports up to 480 Mbps, while USB 3.0 can reach 5 Gbps, enabling fast data transfer for external drives, webcams, and other high-bandwidth devices. Advanced KVM solutions, such as SDVoE-based switches, can support full USB 2.0 bandwidth and even network speeds up to 10 Gbps, allowing complex setups with security card readers, fingerprint scanners, and cameras without performance loss .

Practical Considerations

- o Resolution and refresh rate: Ensure the KVM switch supports the desired resolution (e.g., 4K@60Hz or 8K@60Hz) and refresh rate for your monitors. Real-world performance may be lower than the maximum spec depending on cable quality and graphics card compatibility .
 - o Interface compatibility: Match the KVM switch interfaces to your PCs' outputs (HDMI, DP, USB-C) to avoid signal loss or the need for converters .
 - o Peripheral requirements: For high-speed peripherals, choose a KVM switch with USB 3.0 or higher to maintain full data transfer rates .
 - o Cable quality: Certified high-speed HDMI or DisplayPort cables are essential to achieve the advertised bandwidth and prevent signal degradation .
