Ducts provide full enclosure, which limits ventilation but offers superior protection compared to trays.

- o Design: Cable trays are open structures, whereas cable ducts are fully enclosed.
- o Function: Trays support and organize large quantities of cables with easy access, while ducts primarily protect smaller cable bundles from environmental hazards.
- o Material and Load Capacity: Metal trays are built to handle heavier loads and industrial conditions, unlike most cable ducts which are lighter and intended for smaller installations. While both serve to manage and route cables, their design, purpose, and applications are distinct, making them complementary but separate components in cable management.
