



Minimum distance between cable tray and cabinet top

11 When the pathway is overhead, wire mesh cable tray should be installed with a minimum clearance of 12" above and below (between tray and top of rack/cabinet) the tray. Leave 12" in between the tray and ceiling/building truss structure. When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the distance between them should be no less than 0. This spacing is crucial for adequate maintenance access, ease of inspection, and ensuring proper airflow for effective heat dissipation. It also helps reduce the risk of. The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays. These systems, made from metal or plastic, are open structures designed to support electrical conductors, ensuring proper organization and safety. 3 Provide horizontal elbows, end plates, vertical risers and drops, tees, wyes, expansion joints and reducers where required.
