Fiber Count and Configurations

Multi-core patch cords contain multiple fibers within a single cable jacket, which simplifies cable management and reduces congestion compared to simplex or duplex cords. Common configurations include:

- o LC: Small form factor, widely used in high-density data centers, often in duplex or MPO breakout configurations .
- o MPO/MTP: Multi-fiber push-on connectors for 12F or 24F cords, enabling parallel transmission and simplified high-density patching .
- o SC, ST, or FC: Less common in modern high-density deployments but still used in legacy or specific ODN systems .

Jacket and Material Options

- o Indoor/Outdoor: PVC for basic indoor use, OFNR (riser) for vertical shafts, OFNP (plenum) for fire-resistant air ducts .
- o LSZH (Low Smoke Zero Halogen): Reduces toxic smoke in case of fire, often required in Europe and high-safety environments .

o Kevlar reinforcement: Provides strength and durability for repeated handling .
