Overview of Telecom Namibia Fiber

Telecom Namibia has been actively deploying fiber optic cables to modernize the country's communication infrastructure, replacing outdated copper networks prone to theft and interference . Fiber optic technology transmits data using light pulses, enabling high-speed internet, minimal latency, and stable connections for both businesses and households . This infrastructure supports streaming, online gaming, cloud services, and secure online transactions without interruptions .

Network Expansion and Coverage

Between 2023 and 2024, Telecom Namibia completed eight Fiber-to-the-x (FTTx) projects, laying 233,858 meters of fiber and connecting 7,838 additional erven, particularly in underserved areas such as Katutura in Windhoek and Kuisebmond and Narraville in Walvis Bay . The company plans to invest an additional N\$27 million in 2024/25 to further expand the network, including ongoing projects in Windhoek and upcoming rollouts in Ongwediva and Narraville . The network now spans over 13,000 route kilometers of MetroFibre, with more than 500 Ethernet and IP/MPLS Points of Presence, 228 digital destinations, and over 300 towers for fixed wireless and mobile services .
