



Opening a hole in a masonry electrical distribution box

Preview

For Brick/Block: Use a hammer drill and masonry bit to drill holes for the box's mounting hardware or to create a space for the box. For Concrete: Install the box within the formwork before the concrete pour. Due to previous treatment, it may be difficult to find mortar joints. Once the location is determined, use special screws designed for stone. Installing a masonry electrical box might sound like a job for a superhero, but don't worry--you've got this! Install your boxes and conduit as the block goes up. The brick mason will cut the block around your box. Make sure you use masonry boxes. Install your conduit in 3" lengths as the mason
