Indoor distribution boxes typically use IP44 or IP45 standards. These protection specifications can block solid particles larger than 1 mm in diameter and resist the intrusion of splashing water droplets. When they fail, everything goes dark. Defined by the IEC 60529 standard, IP ratings tell you exactly how well a box guards against solids (like dust) and liquids (like water).
