

Should a 100Mbps fiber optic connection be used with a 100Mbps router

- o **Network Devices:** All devices connected to the router should ideally support 100Mbps or higher to fully utilize the connection. Using older devices with lower speeds may reduce overall network performance.
- o **Performance Factors:** While the router can handle 100Mbps, actual internet performance may be affected by network congestion, Wi-Fi limitations, or device processing capabilities .

Practical Implications

With a 100Mbps router and a 100Mbps fiber connection, you can expect:

- o Smooth streaming of HD video and online gaming for multiple users .
